Flag Display

A homeowner may erect a free standing flagpole to display a United States flag, with a maximum size of four (4) feet by six (6) feet. One additional official Military flag of the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps or Coast Guard or a POW-MIA flag, smaller than the United States flag may be displayed as noted below. Instead of the US Flag, a State of Florida flag, maximum size of four (4) feet by six (6) feet may be displayed following the rules and regulations the State of Florida has issued.

A homeowner may display one portable, removable United States flagpole to display a United States flag, with a maximum size of four (4) feet by six (6) feet. One additional official Military flag of the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps or Coast Guard or a POW-MIA flag, smaller than the United States flag may be displayed as noted below. Instead of the US Flag, a State of Florida flag, maximum size of four (4) feet by six (6) feet may be displayed following the rules and regulations the State of Florida has issued.

Pole Requirements:

The heights shall not exceed twenty (20) feet. Pole shall be made of metal (painted white or brushed aluminum) and a diameter not to exceed three (3) inches. Pole shall be located within six (6) feet from the residence, and not within any easement areas as described on the plat for the property. The mounting base construction shall be of concrete with maximum height two (2) inches above the normal plain of home's lawn. No plaques, plates, or other ornaments shall be placed on the pole or its base except: a metal gold, white or aluminum ball no greater than three (3) inches in diameter or a metal eagle with a wing span no greater than (8.25) inches and not greater than (7.00) inches high may be placed atop the pole. The flag and pole in front of The Lakes of Jacaranda Clubhouse is exempt from the height and size requirements. Architectural review and approval is required from the Architectural Review Committee. All construction must be in compliance with all county and state building codes.

Wall Mount Standard Requirements & Display:

Standard (not greater than five (5) feet in length) shall be made of metal (painted white or brushed aluminum), wood or other durable material. Standard shall be mounted on a metal or durable bracket mount, either fixed or adjustable, either side of garage door or entryway. Bracket mount shall be located no less than four (4) feet or more than seven (7) feet above driveway or entryway elevation at point where it abuts with the garage floor or entryway. No plaques, plates, or other ornaments shall be placed on the pole or its base except: a appropriate ball no greater than three (3) inches in diameter or a metal eagle with a wing span no greater than (8.25) inches and not greater than (7.00) inches high may be placed atop the pole.

The American flag can be flown at anytime from sunrise to sunset. Per federal regulations, for the U. S. flag to be flown at night, the flag must be properly illuminated during the hours of darkness and the

lighting shall not disturb the neighbors. Military Service flags can be flown on these days: Armed Forces Day, Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, Navy Day and Veterans Day. The POW/MIA flag can be flown as appropriate.

Small American flags on mail boxes are exempt from the above rule. Also, small flags placed in the front of the residence on any of the Military Service days are exempt.
